


Bishop Chris McLeod installed as Dean of St Peterâ??s

Kaurna Cultural Bearer, artist, and community leader Mr Karl â??Windaâ?• Telfer offered the Welcome to Country.




Mr Karl Winda Telferâ??s Welcome to Country


The new Dean says he looks forward to working with the Cathedral in strengthening our service to the community, especially with the First Nationsâ?? people of Adelaide.
